For those who may not know:

502. Theology of Ordination. While affirming the scriptural tenet of the universal priesthood and ministry of all believers, ordination reflects the biblical belief that God calls and gifts certain men and women for ministerial leadership in the church. Ordination is the authenticating, authorizing act of the Church, which recognizes and confirms God's call to ministerial leadership as stewards and proclaimers of the gospel and the Church of Jesus Christ. Consequently, ordination bears witness to the Church universal and the world at large that this candidate evidences an exemplary life of holiness, possesses gifts and graces for public ministry, and has a thirst for knowledge, especially for the Word of God, and has the capacity to communicate sound doctrine. (2023 Church of the Nazarene Manual)

Educational Preparation

A person called by God into Christian ministry is called to prepare. Your preparation process will include formal education with at least 26 specific classes, ministry experience, yearly interviews before the Board of Ministry, being nominated by your local church for a local minister's license, then recommended by the Board of Ministry for a District License, attending an intensive weekend assessment, and when all this is complete, one last interview to become recommended by the Board of Ministry for Ordination (an Elder in the Church of the Nazarene). At the time of the next District Assembly, the candidate must meet with the General Superintendent in jurisdiction and be approved by them and voted on during the District Assembly. After this approval, they are ordained that evening by the laying on of hands by the laying on of hands by the elders and prayed over. It is an unforgettable experience to receive this confirmation and take up this responsibility.



Use of Alabaster funds

Alabaster funds are to be used for new churches to:

- Purchase a property or church building
- Purchase or build a church parsonage
 - Build a church building
- Convert a property into a church gathering space
- Meet initial costs to rent a church meeting space for a limited period

Alabaster funds may also be used to:

- Purchase or build missionary homes
- Purchase or build regional or field missions facilities
 - Build or repurpose buildings on Bible college campuses
